


The Litany of the Book of Common Prayer begins here:




V O God the Father of heaven: have mercy upon us miser-a-ble sin-ners.




V O God the Son, redeemer of the world: have mercy upon us miserable sinners.






V O God the Holy Ghost, proceeding from the Father and the Son : have mercy upon us miserable sinners.





V O holy, blessed, and glorious Trinity, three Persons and one God: have mercy upon us miserable sinners.






Litany of 1544 only:

W Holy virgin Mary, mother of God our Saviour Je-su Christ,

These responses are also used in the Litany of Loreto and other Litanies of the Saints.



W All holy Angels and Archangels, and all holy orders of *bless*-ed spirits,



V All holy patriarchs and prophets, apostles, martyrs, confessors and virgins, and all the blessed compa-ny of heaven,





Remember not, Lord, our offences, nor the offences of our forefathers; neither take thou vengeance of our sins: spare us, good Lord, spare thy people, whom thou hast redeemed with thy most precious blood, 8 and be not angry withus for ev-er.



W From all evil and mischief; from sin, from the crafts and assaults of the devil; from thy wrath, and from everlast-ing damnation,



W From all blindness of heart; from pride, vain-glory, and hypocrisy; from envy, hatred, and malice, and all uncharit-a-bleness,



W From fornication, and all other deadly sin; and from all the deceits of the world, the flesh, *and* the devil, R good Lord, deliver us. ①

W From lightning and tempest; from plague, pestilence, and famine; from battle and murder, and from *sud*-den death, R good Lord, deliver us. ②

W From all sedition, privy conspiracy, and rebellion;¹ from all false doctrine, heresy, and schism; from hardness of heart, and contempt of thy Word *and* Commandment, Ry good Lord, deliver us. ①

W We sinners do beseech thee to hear us, O Lord God; and that it may please thee to rule and govern thy holy Church universal in *the* right way,

W That it may please thee to keep and strengthen in the true worshipping of thee, in righteousness and holiness of life, thy Servant Elizabeth, our most gracious Queen and Governor,

W That it may please thee to rule her heart in thy faith, fear, and love, and that she may evermore have affiance in thee, and ever seek thy hon-our and glory, R we beseech thee to hear us, good Lord. ①

W That it may please thee to be her defender and keeper, giving her the victory over all her enemies, R we beseech thee to hear us, good Lord. 2

W That it may please thee to bless and preserve *Philip Duke of Edinburgh*, *Charles Prince of Wales*, and all the Royal Family, Ry we beseech thee to hear us, good Lord. ①

W By the mystery of thy holy Incarnation; by thy holy Nativity and Circumcision; by thy Baptism, Fasting, and Temptation, Ry good Lord, deliver us. 2

W By thine Agony and bloody Sweat; by thy Cross and Passion; by thy precious Death and Burial; by thy glorious Resurrection and Ascension; and by the coming of the Ho-ly Ghost, R good Lord, deliver us. ①

▼ In all time of our tribulation; in all time of our wealth; in the hour of death, and in the day of judgement,
▼ good Lord, deliver us. ②





W That it may please thee to illuminate all Bishops, Priests, and Deacons, with true knowledge and understanding of thy Word; and that both by their preaching and living they may set it forth and shew *it* accordingly, R we beseech thee to hear us, good Lord. ②

W That it may please thee to endue ²the Lords of the Council, and all the Nobility, ² with grace, wisdom, and understanding, № we beseech thee to hear us, good Lord. ①

W That it may please thee to bless and keep the Magistrates, giving them grace to execute justice, and to maintain truth, R we beseech thee to hear us, good Lord. ②

W That it may please thee to bless and keep all thy people, R we beseech thee to hear us, good Lord. ①

W That it may please thee to give to all nations unity, peace, and concord, R we beseech thee to hear us, good Lord. 2

W That it may please thee to give us an heart to love and dread thee, and diligently to live after thy commandments, R we beseech thee to hear us, good Lord. ①

W That it may please thee to give to all thy people increase of grace, to hear meekly thy Word, and to receive it with pure affection, and to bring forth the fruits of the Spirit, R we beseech thee to hear us, good Lord. ②

W That it may please thee to bring into the way of truth all such as have erred, and are deceived, № we beseech thee to hear us, good Lord. ①

W That it may please thee to strengthen such as do stand; and to comfort and help the weak-hearted; and to raise up them that fall; and finally to beat down Satan under our feet, R we beseech thee to hear us, good Lord. ②

W That it may please thee to succour, help, and comfort all that are in danger, neces sity, and tribulation, R we beseech thee to hear us, good Lord. ①

W That it may please thee to preserve all that travel ³by land or by water,³ all women labouring of child, all sick persons, and young children; and to shew thy pity upon all prisoners and captives, R we beseech thee to hear us, good Lord. ②

W That it may please thee to defend, and provide for, the fatherless children, and widows, and all that are desolate and oppressed, R we beseech thee to hear us, good Lord. ①

W That it may please thee to have mercy upon all men, R we beseech thee to hear us, good Lord. ②


W That it may please thee to forgive our enemies, persecutors, and slanderers, and to turn their hearts, R we beseech thee to hear us, good Lord. ①

W That it may please thee to give us true repentance; to forgive us all our sins, negligences, and ignorances; and to endue us with the grace of thy Holy Spirit, to amend our lives according to thy holy Word, R we beseech thee to hear us, good Lord. ①
