This keyboard reduction contains everything in the Performance edition. Although I primarily intended it as a rehearsal aid, it would not be unreasonable to use it in performance. It shares the following features with the Performance edition:

* Suggested tempo markings.

* Accidentals—those in the source are full size; those I added (e.g., *musica ficta*) are printed small; all are in the normal position.

Mensurstrich without ties proved to be more trouble than it was worth, so I used regular *Mensurstrich*.

Important note: I do not play the organ, so I cannot guarantee whether this part is even playable. Will organists let me know by leaving a comment on the discussion page? I will happily consider improvements, including changing to a non-*Mensurstrich* layout. (Since they depend on the needs of rehearsal or performance and on personal taste, I do not plan to add registrations.)
