T.  Both of these are ne-ces-sa-ry; Both from Je-sus we re-ceive. \_\_\_\_  
Are the shp-wrecked saved by sin-king? Can the ru-ined rise by fears? \_\_\_\_

B.  Bro-ken hearts and hum-ble wal-kers, These are dear in Je-sus' eyes. \_\_\_\_

Tr.  We are poor, and weak, and sil-ly, And to eve-ry e-vil prone:  
Le-prou-s souls, un-sound and fil-thy, Come be-fore him as you are;

T.  Would-be Chris-tian, du-ly pon-der These in thine im-par-tial mind,  
O! be-ware of trust ill-groun-ded; 'Tis but fan-cied faith at most,

B.  Tin-king sounds of dis-pu-ta-tion, Na-ked know-ledge, all are vain;

Tr.  Yet our Je-sus loves us free-ly, And re-ceive us for his own care.  
'Tis the sick man, not the heal-thy, Needs the good Phy-si-cian's care.

T.  And let no man put a-sun-der What the Lord has wise-ly joined.  
To be cures and put not be woun-ded, To be saved be-fore you're lost.
