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## Notes:

The alto and tenor parts are printed in the alto and tenor clefs respectively in the source.

Only the first verse of the text is given in the source: the other two verses given here have been added editorially, on the basis of the heading 'Verses 1st 4th and last' in the source.

The source contains a fully written-out keyboard accompaniment: with the exception of the first note, which is given here in the bass part, this accompaniment doubles the keyboard parts throughout, and has been omitted from the present edition.

This setting is attributed to 'W. Linley' in the source: the list of subscribers to the book includes 'Linley, W. Esq. Furnival's Inn'.
